UND SMHS Strategic Plan Goal 8: The SMHS will enhance its purposes of education, service, and discovery by focusing additional efforts toward achieving the broad goals stated in the School's Healthcare Workforce Initiative.

1. Describe if/how your unit has addressed this goal.

The Department of Sports Medicine has made necessary changes to ensure athletic training needs of the state continue to be met now and in the future. A national mandate has required the DSM to transition its Bachelor of Science in Athletic Training to a Masters degree (no later than the fall of 2022). Without the program transitioning to the Master's degree, students would not be able to sit for national board exams and not be able to practice in North Dakota. A new curriculum based on maximizing clinical education and PBLs has been developed. The first students will be taken into the masters program in anticipation of starting classes in the Summer of 2022.

2. Describe how your efforts are being assessed.

Transition to the Masters in Athletic Training degree started about 3 years ago and has been approved by the SMHS, UND, NDUS State Board of Higher Education, NDUS Chancellor, the Higher Learning Commission, and the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education (CAATE).

New coursework and associated content has been developed through a peer review process.

3. Describe how your unit analyzed these data and what assessments were determined.

All entities, within UND or external, have approved the new academic program.

Coursework and associated content is completed for the first 2 semesters after peer review process. Peer faculty reviewed PBL and coursework to ensure quality material is produced. Final coursework has yet to be peer reviewed by the DSM curriculum committee and this will happen in the 2021-2022 academic year.

4. Describe how your unit will implement any further changes and what barriers may exist.

In the 2021-2022 academic year, the DSM will implement an admission process for students, as well as teach its first courses in the Masters in summer of 2022. The admissions process will be assessed following the first cycle of admissions to streamline the process and assess the quality of applicants.

Coursework will be assessed through student feedback and further peer review of coursework following the initial offering of the course.
